

TREAT BAG LATTE POUCH WITH PULL OUT TAG

Stampin' Up! Supplies Used:

Stamps: Harvest Hellos (150581)

BUNDLE: Harvest Hellos - includes Harvest Hellos Stamp Set & Apple Builder Punch (153037)

Cardstocks: Crumb Cake (120953), Terracotta Tile (150884), Early Espresso (119686), Whisper White (100730)

Embossing: Subtle 3D Embossing Folder (151775), 3D Embossing Folder Plate (149658)

Punch: 1" Circle (119868), Scalloped Tag Topper (133324), Apple Builder (150663)

Ink: Early Espresso (147114)

Ribbon & Twine: Linen Thread (104199), Terracotta Tile 1/2" Scalloped Linen (149705)

Misc: Copper Dotted Treat Bags (149609), Starbucks Pumpkin Spice Latte Sachet

Adhesives: Tear & Tape (138995), Snail (104332), Dimensionals (104430)

To make the Pouch:

Take a Copper Dotted Treat Bag:



Fold in half and apply strong adhesive tape to one of the surfaces:



And press down to secure:



And decorate! You have two pockets to fill on each side – one for a tag and one for a treat!

To decorate:

1. Cut a piece of Crumb Cake cardstock to measure 2 3/8" x 2 1/2" and texture using the Subtle 3D Embossing Folder. Adhere in place to the front panel.
2. Use a stamp from Harvest Hellos to create the pumpkin and use the Apple Builder Punch to cut it out along with the stem – adhere in place
3. Stamp your tag and cut out using a 1" Circle Punch – use a Dimensional to adhere in place

To make the pull out Tag:

1. Cut a 2" strip of Crumb Cake cardstock and shape one end using the Scalloped Tag Topper Punch – trim the other end so that your tag measures 6 3/4"
2. Thread through a piece of ribbon and tie a bow around the neck finishing with a bow
3. Cut a piece of Terracotta Tile cardstock to measure 5 7/8" x 1 3/4" and adhere on top
4. Cut a piece of Whisper White cardstock to measure 5 3/4" x 1 1/2" and adhere in place
5. Write your message and pop into the rear pocket

Pop a Pumpkin Spice Latte sachet into the front pocket and it is ready for gifting 😊
